Other Information and Assessment Methods:

All candidates must satisfactorily complete a language, literacy and numeracy support assessment (LLN) during the enrolment process. This will occur prior to course confirmation. Eligibility Criteria - Work Readiness Program

- Clients must be unemployed or under employed.
- Clients must be an Australian citizen, permanent resident or holders of a sub-class 309, 444, 785, 790, 820 or 826 visa; secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 457; and holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or 790.
- Clients under the age of 18 who are mandatory high school age must have an accompanying NOA or have an exemption.
- Clients must have a valid USI to be able to access a state-funded training place.
